


UWBH's Focus on Education

WHY? Key studies show that education is the foundation to future opportunities:



- More likely to hold a job and have higher earnings
- More likely to own their own car and home
- Children who fall behind in school are more likely to drop out and dropouts are eight times more likely than graduates to end up in prison






UWBH's Focus on Education

Access to Quality Childhood Education can help in solving some of the chronic issues identified in our 2019 Community Needs Assessment...


- Access to higher paying job opportunities




Reading Proficiency at the third grade reading level is a strong indicator of academic success and future opportunities

DID YOU KNOW? 54% of third graders in South Dakota ARE NOT READING PROFICIENT


What is Systems Change?

Addressing the root causes of social problems by **getting** individual people and individual organizations to change in a coordinated way that involves policies, financing, and services motivated toward a specific change or specific sets of changes



How do you evaluate Systems Change?

Acknowledge the complexity of the situation by capturing data through literature reviews, observations, and conversations






Economic Recovery Depends on Early Learning & Quality Education Efforts

\$279 Million – Possible Industry **Revenue** in the Child Care Industry


82% (26,698) children under the age of 3 have working parents. Yet, parents need to go back to work and don't have a place to enroll their child

36% of families with children had a decline in income compared to 29% of families without children.






