United Way of the Black Hills hopes you and your loved ones are staying healthy and safe during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. We're sharing updates on how we are helping our community, ways that you can get involved and resources to help you navigate during this time.

This week, we awarded grants to three more organizations, totaling **\$33,144**; for a total of **\$79,444** in grant awards to date:

Catholic Social Services - \$20,000

The need: An increased need in emergency economic assistance applications (rental assistance, vouchers for medications and food), as well as mental health tele-counseling services.

How these funds will assist the need: To provide economic assistance to families in need, and to provide mental tele-health counseling services.

Wellfully - \$8,144

The need: To accommodate an influx of residents coming into their care. How these funds will assist the need: Purchasing additional beds and supplies to serve more kids in residential care.

Youth and Family Services - \$5,000

The need: Families enrolled are facing economic hardship due to job loss, reduced hours, etc. They want to assist these families in getting the emergency needs they require.

How these funds will assist the need: For food and non-food essential items, and to provide rent assistance (an average of \$500 each for up to nine families) and/or co-pay for medical, dental, and mental health services for families in need.

To date, the UNITED We Stand COVID-19 Relief Fund has raised \$412,427.04, and has received 19 applicants for funding. Three applications are currently under review.

UWBH will continue accepting applications until all funds from the UNITED We Stand COVID-19 Relief Fund have been distributed.

Nonprofit organizations that have experienced an increased demand for services or resources due to the pandemic are encouraged to apply for the grant.


