
Are you driven by making sure that children have quality after-school programs, mentorship opportunities, and early learning opportunities?

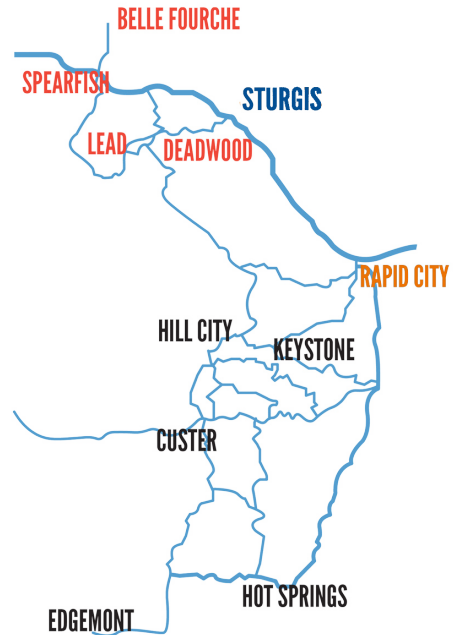

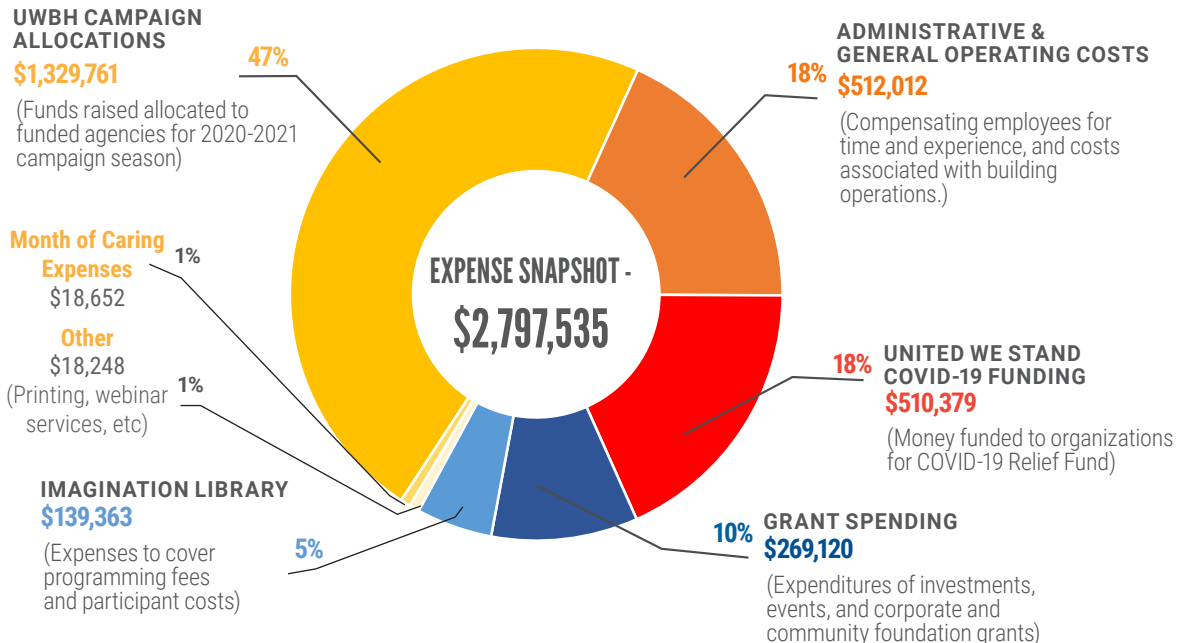
Our Commitment to Transparency

UNITED, WE FIGHT FOR MENTAL HEALTH

In 2020, we invested \$194,813 in 14 mental health programs and services such as counseling and crisis support, through both our allocations and UNITED We Stand COVID-19 Relief fund. Our support touched the lives of **8,877*** people who utilized mental health services.

In our 2019 Community Needs Assessment, we identified the #1 key issue in all areas we serve is a lack of affordable and available mental health services. We know that the effects of COVID-19 have exacerbated this issue through job uncertainty, isolation, and illness.

Our Mental Health Initiative was developed to identify existing gaps in services throughout the Black Hills area, and to find solutions to expand on the availability of services, while also making them affordable for those in need.

Who does mental health affect?

Anyone can be affected by mental health. In fact, according to the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), 1 in 6 people will struggle with a mental health issue like depression, anxiety, or PTSD.

Why focus on mental health?

Mental health can truly impact other needs that we address. If a person is struggling with a mental illness, it may create stressful barriers to finding or retaining employment, which can subsequently impact one's ability to keep food on the table, and pay their bills.

Hope is just a call away. 2-1-1 Helpline Center

"The Helpline Center answered a call from an older female who had been diagnosed with COVID-19 months earlier and was still experiencing lingering symptoms such as extreme fatigue and brain fog. She had been isolated in her home for 2 months.

Her family and friends were supportive, called her, and brought groceries and care packages, but after so long she just couldn't burden them with all the emotions she was struggling with and her continued illness.

Helpline staff talked with her on a regular basis and she reported that these conversations were her only chance to talk about herself and vent all her fears and frustrations.

Her previous counselor was not seeing patients during COVID-19, so our service has been a bridge for her." - Helpline Center

UNITED, WE FIGHT FOR EDUCATION



In 2020, we invested \$677,806 in 29 education and child care programs and services. Our support touched the lives of 22,921* children in the Black Hills.

Less than 50% of third graders in South Dakota are reading proficient.

This is important due to the shift from learning to read, to reading to learn that occurs at the third grade level. Data indicates that lack of fundamental reading skills affects future academic success of students.

Black Hills Reads, our Education Initiative, helps to ensure children reach this reading milestone. There is so much that goes into this milestone, such as: access to birth to age 5 services and quality child care, access to books, access to medical and dental care, school attendance, and summer learning programs.

In addition to providing grants to nonprofits and libraries, we make this work happen by offering a variety of resources for parents and organizations such as:

- **Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program** - Children age birth to 5 receive a free mailed book to their door each month.
- **Investing in mentorship and afterschool programs** to ensure children are having a well-rounded experience.
- **Advocating efforts** for more affordable quality child care opportunities for Black Hills residents through the Early Learner SD program.

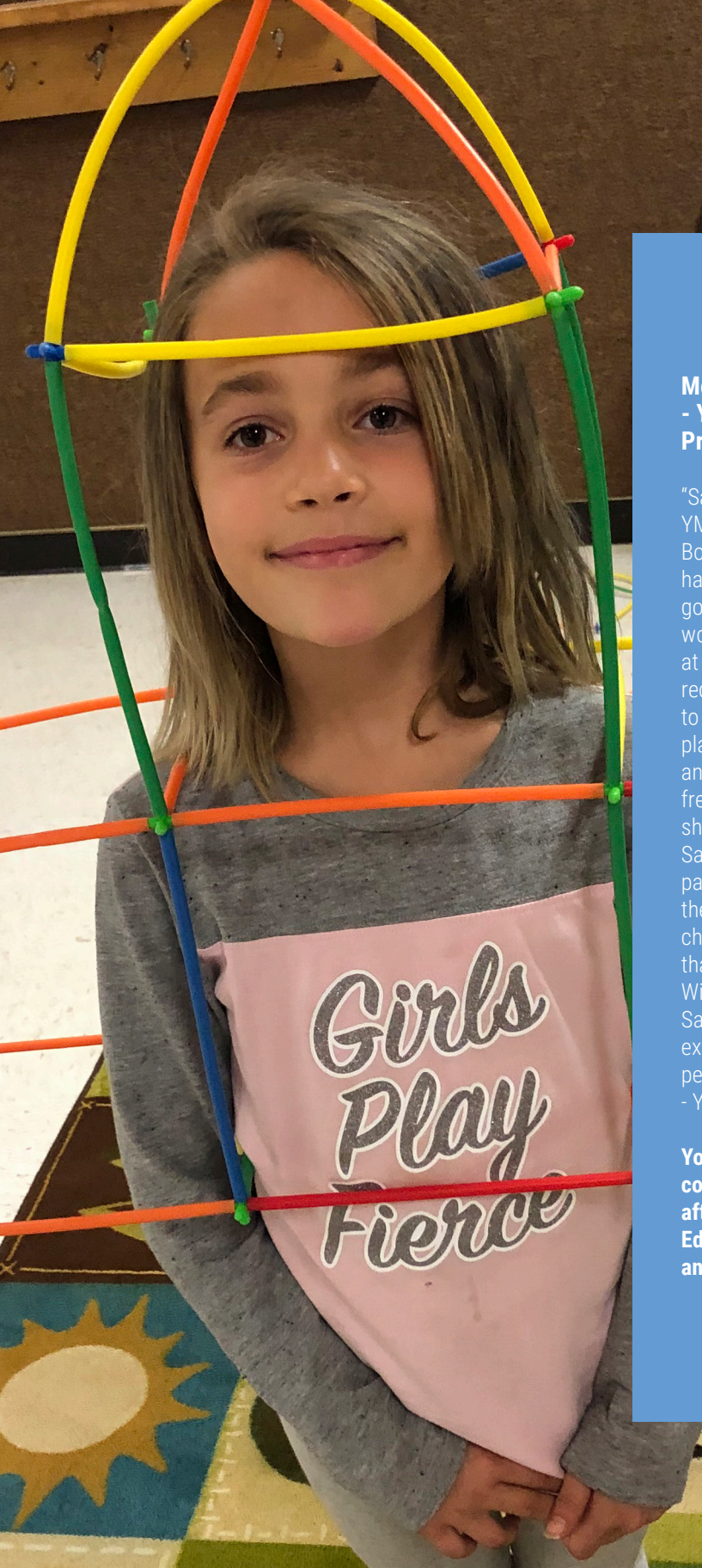

More than an after-school program - YMCA Edgemont After-School Program

"Sage is a 2nd grader in the Edgemont YMCA. This is her 3rd year in the program. Both of her parents work full time, so having a place for Sage and her sister to go after school, until their parents are off work, is essential for their family. While at Kidstop, the afterschool program, Sage receives a nutritious snack, has time to play with her friends, participates in planned arts and crafts, STEM activities, and outside play. In addition, she receives free tutoring help in math and reading so she doesn't fall behind her classmates. Sage also has the opportunity to participate in sports programs throughout the year, put on by the YMCA, such as cheerleading, soccer, dance, and basketball that happen during the Kidstop time frame. Without the Edgemont YMCA programs, Sage wouldn't have the opportunity to experience worthwhile activities for her personal growth and enhancement."

UNITED, WE FIGHT FOR FINANCIAL STABILITY

In 2020, we invested \$240,828 in 7 financial stability programs such as affordable housing and home maintenance programs, affordable transportation, adult life skills, financial education services, and financial assistance programs.

There are a variety of areas that play into the financial stability of a person, and each area is just as important. When a person is unable to pay utility bills, rent, or transportation, it can create a stressful situation that can impact their health and wellbeing.

Through both our allocations and UNITED We Stand COVID-19 Relief fund, **our support touched the lives of 51,115* people who utilized these services through our funding.**

In our 2019 Community Needs Assessment, we identified lack of affordable housing and economic opportunities in our top 7 priority needs.

Our new Community Impact Grants target these priority needs, and we look forward to collaborating with other organizations and key leaders that are addressing the issues of financial security and affordable housing.

A foundation for a brighter future

After years of living on the Reservation without heat, electricity, or running water, and then in a cramped apartment in the city, Shawna and Joan felt purchasing their 1981 trailer was a sound decision.

It wasn't until they moved in that they discovered what their neighbor referred to as a "can of worms." Instead of replacing the siding, the former owner put new siding on top of the old, sealing in the black mold and causing the home to rot from the inside out.

The mother and daughter knew the problem needed to be addressed, but with a fixed income and their savings spent, their options were limited.

When Habitat's Home Repair team arrived, the women were feeling skeptical, but hopeful. Within a few weeks, fixing up Shawna and Joan's trailer became a neighborhood affair.

Michael-Lee from across the street came over to help paint the siding with her father Andy, a former Habitat volunteer, who helped the family replace the storm door.

Shawna and Joan encouraged a neighbor with two small children living in a gutted, leaking trailer to apply to Habitat and offered to help with the project. The Home Repair team has completed this project and we have received two additional applications from their neighborhood. Shawna and Joan, once skeptical about their skills, have completed over 100 sweat equity hours each, double the expectation.

UNITED, WE FIGHT FOR HEALTH

In 2020, we invested \$573,982 in 29 health programs and services such as domestic violence shelter for victims, medication voucher programs, food assistance, mental health services and more through both our allocations and UNITED We Stand COVID-19 Relief fund. **Our support touched the lives of 42,708* people who utilized health services through our funding.**

Health plays a key role in the development of children, and for people to maintain focus and energy, to perform day-to-day activities. Without proper nutrition, medical care, and counseling - a person's wellbeing can decline and impact other areas of their life.

In addition to mental health being identified as one of the 7 top priority needs in the Black Hills; lack of access to a diverse range of affordable food options and more home and family life services were also identified as top needs in the Black Hills.

The home and family life services category includes: domestic violence shelter options for families escaping violence, protecting children of neglect, and family counseling services.

Our new Community Impact Grants target these priority needs, and we look forward to collaborating with other organizations and key leaders that are addressing these issues.

Addressing Mental Health as a gateway to other resources

Melisa is a middle-aged woman, who was suffering from depression/anxiety, along with nervous system issues and multiple other medical issues when she arrived at the Community Health Center of the Black Hills.

“When she came to us as a patient, she was unemployed and struggling with housing, at times living in a tent at a campground in the summer, at times living in her car, and at times in a motel - all with her multiple kids.

We were able to voucher her behavioral health medications to help stabilize her mental health, thanks to the United Way. We worked with her to get her more stable housing and actual employment, working with area agencies like Love, Inc, Feeding South Dakota, the Salvation Army, Dress for Success, and other partners.

Today, she has an apartment, a job, and has expanded her use of Community Health to start seeing us for some basic dental needs as well.”
